However, our efforts this past year captured the attention of those in power who were able to force the owner to take action. In early Fall, along with other minor repairs, tarps were positioned over holes in the roof.



Although the work done is no where near what is necessary to restore historic integrity to the Tavern, it is a start. The Tavern has survived another year of neglect, another year of Ohio weather, including the remnants of a hurricane. The Tavern still stands, and so, TUTPS still fights for its preservation!

2012 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Despite growing concern for the future of The Old Tavern, The Unionville Tavern Preservation Society continued with our grassroots effort to Save The Tavern! In 2012, we made great progress towards our ultimate goal of preserving and protecting the Tavern. This past year TUTPS:

- Established The Friends of The Old Tavern membership program Individuals and Families can now pledge their support to the Tavern and its preservation by joining our organization. Although the Tavern is closed, it continues to be a symbol of community, a place "Where Friends Meet".
- Partnered with Madison Community Improvement Corporation (MCIC) Our partnership with MCIC has allowed us to offer charitable gift letters for memberships and donations contributed to the MCIC Save The Tavern fund.
- Increased Public Awareness utilizing several media outlets, professional collaborations, participation in community events and general networking, TUTPS has been able to increase public support for the effort. We launched a website: www.savethetavern.org, ended the year with over 500 followers on Facebook, and increased our group of volunteers.
- Nominated the Tavern for the Preservation Ohio's "Ohio's Most Endangered Site 2012" list TUTPS nominated the Tavern for the 2012 list and in September it was announced the Tavern had made the list. Placement on the list has provided the Tavern with some much needed publicity to a wider audience.
- Campaigned for Resolutions In October 2012, Madison Township Trustees unanimously passed a resolution in recognition and in support of TUTPS and the effort to Save The Tavern. TUTPS also petitioned the Lake County Commissioners for their support and they responded with a proclamation endorsing our effort and encouraging Lake County citizens to become active in our campaign.

THE YEAR AHEAD In 2013, TUTPS will continue to fulfill our mission and promise to Save The Tavern! We intend to complete our own 501(c)3 non-profit status, expand our Board of Directors, and increase our fundraising efforts as we give voice to the Tavern and preserve its history. We look forward to increased activity in the year ahead and hope you will continue to support us as we move forward.



2012 Highlights: • The Friends of The Old Tavern membership program was established and created \$730.00 in revenue. Members of the community joined the effort as individuals (\$25) or as a family (\$40). • The summer raffle generated \$422.00. Harriett Hydinger was the winner of a set of dishes used in the Tavern during the 1930's and 1940's. Thank you to Mr. & Mrs. Lowell Keairns for the donation of the dishes. • The addition of Navy Blue "Save The Tavern!" t-shirts to our STT products helped to increase our sales to \$764.00.
