Lake County has enacted tax foreclosure against the owner of the Tavern. However, the fate of our beloved Tavern still remains uncertain. While we wait for the results of the foreclosure process, we watch in despair as the building falls apart before our eyes. In 2013 we witnessed the high winds tear the tarps off the roof, boards from the ceiling of the porch fall to the ground, and gutters pull away from the building only to fall onto a window awning and pull it from the building. ### WHAT WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED...

- Preservation Ohio's "Ohio's Most Endangered Site 2013" list TUTPS nominated the Tavern for the second year in a row. The Tavern was again one of the 11 on the endangered list. (http://preserveohio.com/ohios-most-endangered-historic-sites-2013)
- 501(c)3 paperwork completed and filed filing our paperwork is a great milestone in our efforts. MCIC will remain our fiscal advisor until we have received our own 501(c)3.
- Website upgrade savethetavern.org is a necessary outlet to connect the Tavern to the community. Upgrading our website allows us more flexibility and the ability to utilize additional features to enhance our outreach capabilities.
- On-line shop Revenue from sales are an essential part of funding our organization. In late November we opened the on-line shop. Save The Tavern! t-shirts and stickers are now available on-line. We have shipped orders to as far away as Hawaii!
- Investment in community relations we value the importance of the community and therefore continued to nurture our relationships with the Madison Historical Society, MCIC, Preservation Ohio, and the Friends of Freedom Society, Inc., and countless individuals who share our common goal. We participated in local events, held community meetings, updated our website, and increased to nearly 1000 followers on our Facebook page. We are proud that the Save The Tavern!™ community stretches beyond Madison Township and Lake County. Our outreach is local, state, and country wide. You have helped make that happen!


